TOWN OF PINCHER CREEK BYLAW NO. 1547-AQ

BEING a bylaw of the Town of Pincher Creek in the Province of Alberta, to amend Bylaw No. 1547, being the municipal Land Use Bylaw;

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Pincher Creek has received a request to accommodate "Drive-In Restaurant" as a use in the Transitional Commercial – C4 land use district;

AND WHEREAS the purpose of the proposed amendment is to add the Use of "Drive-In Restaurant" as a Discretionary Use in the Transitional Commercial – C4 land use district;

AND WHEREAS the municipality must prepare a corresponding bylaw and provide for its consideration at a public hearing;

NOW THEREFORE, under the authority and subject to the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter M-26, as amended, the Council of the Town of Pincher Creek in the Province of Alberta duly assembled does hereby enact the following:

- 1. That "Drive-In Restaurant" be added as a Discretionary Use to Schedule 2, Transitional Commercial C4, Section 1.
- 2. That Schedule 4, Standards of Development, of Land Use Bylaw 1547 is amended as indicated in attached Schedule A to add standards for Drive-In Restaurants.
- 3. Bylaw No. 1547, being the municipal Land Use Bylaw, is hereby amended and consolidated.
- 4. This bylaw shall come into effect upon third and final reading thereof.

Schedule A

Town of Pincher Creek Land Use Bylaw No. 1547 as amended by Bylaw No. 1547-AQ

AMENDMENTS: Add standards for Drive-In Restaurants

Add a section to the land use bylaw Schedule 4, Standards of Development

Section 32 Drive-In Restaurants

- (a) Any drive-in restaurant may be located only:
 - (i) Where it can be shown that it does not inhibit safe traffic movement; and
 - (ii) Where it is provided within a shopping centre site; or
 - (iii) Where it is provided along a highway or main arterial road; or
 - (iv) At the intersection of two or more public roadways, not including lanes.
- (b) The Development Authority shall, where necessary to mitigate the effect on adjacent residential properties, regulate the hours of operation of the drive-thru portion of a restaurant.
- (c) Drive-thru aisles shall be:
 - (i) when adjacent to a residential district, screened or landscaped to the satisfaction of the Development Authority to provide a noise barrier for the adjacent residential properties;
 - (ii) a minimum width of 3.66 m (12 ft.);
 - (iii) fenced, where necessary, to prevent access to a lane or street or to act as a screen;
 - (iv) sited so that pedestrians entering and exiting the building are not required to cross the driving aisle.
 - i. When it is absolutely necessary for pedestrian to have to cross drive-thru aisles, crosswalks shall be clearly demarcated from the parking area to the building entrance;
 - (v) sited so that other vehicles leaving or entering the parking lot won't be impeded by others using the drive-thru.
- (d) Areas required for parking or circulation of vehicles shall be hard surfaced to the satisfaction of the Development Authority.
- (e) Parking shall be provided in accordance with Schedule 9.
- (f) Parking stalls dedicated to mobile order pick-up shall not be included in the computation of parking requirements in Schedule 9.
- (g) Exits and entrances shall be as approved by the Development Authority, and circulation within the lot shall be directional and adequately signed.
- (h) Front, side, and rear yards abutting parking or circulation areas shall be adequately landscaped to the satisfaction of the Development Authority and in accordance with Schedule 10.
- (i) In addition to off-street parking requirements, a drive-thru is required to provide adequate stacking space for vehicles utilizing the drive-thru. The use of laneways or roadways as stacking space is prohibited.
 - (i) For new developments, a drive-thru is required to provide a minimum stacking space of 30.5 m (100 ft.) from order box to pick-up window.
 - (ii) For existing buildings to be retrofitted to a drive-in restaurant, the stacking space shall be at the discretion of the Development Authority and shall ensure vehicle queuing does not hinder vehicle or pedestrian safety or flow.

- (j) Drive-in restaurants may have outdoor speakers (menu order box) provided:
 - (i) The speakers are not located within 30.5 m (100 ft.) of a property line of any parcel designated as a residential district; or
 - (ii) They are separated from a residential district by a non-residential building;
 - (iii) The Development Authority may vary the distance in subsection (i) where adequate buffering has been provided to lessen the impact on adjacent residential properties.
- (k) Waste collection receptacles for the purpose of disposing of rubbish and debris shall be provided on the exterior of the restaurant as required by the Development Authority.
- Applications for drive-in restaurants must be accompanied by a site plan that meets the measurable standards of this section and illustrates the location of site access(es), garbage receptacles, landscaping, etc.

Re: Public Hearing Comments for Proposed Land Use Bylaw Amendment No. 1547-AQ

BACKGROUND

The Town of Pincher Creek Council gave first reading in July 2023 to an amendment to Land Use Bylaw No. 1547 to add Drive-in Restaurant as a Discretionary Use in the Transitional Commercial – C4 land use district. The Subway restaurant on Main St. is completing renovations and desire to offer a drive-thu window service. As the land use district does not have a listed permitted or discretionary use to accommodate a Drive-in Restaurant, the use is currently prohibited, and the use provisions of the bylaw cannot be waived. Council gave first reading to the proposed bylaw "as amended" to consider as a discretionary use (as opposed to a permitted). If Drive-in Restaurant is listed as a discretionary use in the C4 district such a use would be available for any such zoned lot owner to apply for the use. Also, as part of the bylaw amendment, a schedule of proposed Drive-in restaurant requirements and standards of development was included to be incorporated into the land use bylaw to help manage such a use.

An extensive overview of the particular Subway restaurant situation was provided to Council at the time of first reading. The Subway drive-in/pick-up window has been boarded up and not used for more than a decade and it is deemed a discontinued use. Any recommencement of the use requires a new development permit approval which may only be allowed if the use is prescribed in the district. It is noted that the use is presently only allowed in the Highway Commercial - C2 land use district of the bylaw.

COMMENTS

As a refresher for Council, the land use bylaw's definition of Drive-in restaurant is as follows:

Drive-in restaurant means a restaurant which offers car attendant service or drive-through pickup service.

The intent of the Transitional Commercial – C4 land use district is: to identify residential areas within the community whereby the commercial expansion of the downtown may be feasible and/or desirable to develop.

From a planning perspective, adding the Drive-in Restaurant use to the Transitional Commercial – C4 land use district is problematic for several reasons. Typical planning and land use concerns associated with drive-thru type uses that require consideration, especially in proximity or adjacent to residential uses, are:

• a drive-thru generates additional local traffic, and if poorly designed or configured to accommodate such, it can create safety issues due to vehicle back-ups on the adjoining street.

Exiting from the drive-thru lane into the public street also needs to be carefully planned and sited for the lot so there are no blind spots that may cause potential collisions with pedestrians or vehicle traffic;

- odours & air quality idling vehicles waiting in queue lines lessen the quality of air in the vicinity;
- excessive noise from menu speaker boxes, patrons shouting orders, vehicle engines idling;
- light pollution from vehicle headlights, site and building lights; and
- litter and debris issues from blowing food packaging.

Adding the use to the C4 district may be premature as the C4 district's purpose should be carefully considered by Council as part of the forthcoming land use bylaw review process. The district may be revised and could become more focussed on various higher-density residential uses and affordable housing accommodations with mixed commercial uses. Drive-ins could create more conflict with residential uses and many C4 lots are also not appropriately sized for drive-in restaurant stacking que aisles. If proposed Bylaw 1547-AQP is adopted to add Drive-in restaurant as a discretionary use in the C4 district, then a development permit application for the development may be decided on by the Municipal Development and Subdivision Authority (MDSA).

At the conclusion of the public hearing, potential options Council will have available to consider are:

- 1. Refuse the amendment application if the use in the C4 district is deemed to be not suitable for the reasons as previously outlined.
- 2. Approve "as amended" the application as applied for (i.e., add as a permitted use rather than discretionary) along with the bylaw standards of development schedule to include and add the drive-in use standards to help regulate the use. Council must be aware that if Drive-in restaurant is added as a permitted use to the C4 district a development permit application could be made for any parcel of land within the C4 district, and the Development Authority is duty bound to issue a permit if the bylaw requirements are met.
- 3. Approve the amendment as given at first reading (discretionary use) and give second and third reading of the bylaw to allow the use as a discretionary use in the C4 district along with the drive-in use standards of development.

It is recognized it is often difficult for a municipal Council to not support or accommodate an existing business in the community that desires to update/expand their business. The challenging part is weighing such business plans with other competing or conflicting interests. Thus, it is prudent of Council to carefully consider any public comments that may be submitted. There are two issues at play with this bylaw proposal – one is specific for the Subway restaurant itself at their location and how it may impact neighbors – and the other is the broader consideration of how such a use may be applied in the general C4 district. If considering allowing the use, Council should also be satisfied the proposed development standards are suitable to manage the use. It is noted that for some of the standards prepared (if they were incorporated into the bylaw), the Subway parcel would need a waiver by the MDSA as some criteria (e.g., driving aisles, separation distances) could not be met. Council cannot guarantee the MDSA will do so as the MDSA is independent of Council, and there is also an appeal process that would be available.

If the proposed bylaw amendment is defeated, but Council sees merit in the drive-in proposal specifically for the Subway restaurant situation on its own, an alternative option may be that the applicant could be encouraged to apply for an amendment to perhaps Direct Control. This would enable it to be site specific for the Subway restaurant and so that the use is not available to all lands designated as C4. Adopting or refusing to adopt the bylaw amendment as granted first reading is at the sole prerogative of Council, and there is no appeal process of such a decision (except to the Court of Appeal on a question of law).

The Operations Department has reviewed proposed Land Use Bylaw Amendment 1547-AQ and <u>does not</u> support the amendment to include Drive-In Restaurants as a discretionary use to the C4 District.

As C4 is a "transitional" district, it is designed as a buffer zone between commercial and residential. As per the Land Use Bylaw, the C4 district's intent is to "identify residential areas within the community whereby the commercial expansion of the downtown may be feasible and/or desirable to develop." Drive-in restaurants are an intensified use which have noise, light, and traffic implications which are more suited for and traditionally accepted in dedicated commercial zones such as C2 and C3 (in which drive-in restaurants are permitted uses in both districts). The Operations Department's assessment of the C4 district is that allowance of drive-in restaurants in the C4 district introduces unnecessary clashes between residential and commercial properties particularly relating to noise (from ordering and vehicle noise), lights (from headlights and ordering boards), and traffic.

Update on SASCI

Current Status

BRIDGEBuilder Community Development Project, Phase I (January 2019 - December 2023)

A project for building community capacities to capitalize on change, including fundraising, digital transformation and energy transition. BRIDGE = <u>B</u>uilding <u>Regional Innovation</u>, <u>D</u>evelopment & <u>G</u>overnance <u>Excellence</u>. Phase I has focused on building capacities for raising funds to support community development:

A full-time Community Grant Specialist (Ms. Liza Dawber) employed under contract since 2019, whose position will be supported with funding from the Town and M.D. budgets starting in 2024.

A part-time Fund Development Specialist (Ms. Andrea Hlady) employed under contract since 2022, whose scope of work will be completed by the end of 2023. Building on the research and recommendations of the Fund Development Specialist, SASCI will partner with an established Community Foundation to establish a permanent Community Development Fund for the Town and District of Pincher Creek and (possibly) the Piikani First Nation.

Administration

SASCI was turned down for operational funding from FCSS in 2023 because of a change in FCSS funding priorities. SASCI has been unable to find alternative sources of grant funding for operations, and is applying for \$20,000 of operational funding from Joint Council to cover the cost of employing its part-time Administrator (Ms. Carrie Cooley) through 2024. Without its Administrator, SASCI will be unable to operate.

2024 Objectives

BRIDGEBuilder Community Development Project, Phase II (January 2024 - December 2026)

The second phase of the BRIDGE Builder project will focus on building community capacities to capitalize on digital transformation and energy transition. These economically disruptive global trends are driven by accelerating advancements in digital and energy technologies, which require individuals, businesses and communities to develop new competencies.

SASCI is now raising funds to establish two full-time contract positions under BRIDGEBuilder Phase II, namely a Regional Energy Specialist and a Regional Digital/Data Specialist. If sufficient and reliable funding is available, SASCI will also consider establishing a third full-time contract position for a Regional Housing Specialist to address the region's worsening shortage of attainable and affordable housing.

Administration

SASCI intends to raise funds to expand its administrative capacities in 2024, in response to growing demand for administrative support from local non-profit groups and organizations.

PURPOSE:

For Council to provide direction on potential solar panel installation at the Lebel Mansion.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek respectfully decline the grant funding from Enel Green Power and not proceed with the Solar Array Installation at the Lebel Mansion.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

Administration presented the Lebel Mansion Solar Installation at the June 26, 2023 regular meeting of Council. Council passed resolution #23-300 "That Council for the Town of Pincher defer indefinitely to the August 28, 2023 Council meeting in consideration with proceeding with the project."

As part of the 2023 budget deliberations, a solar exhibit was proposed at the Lebel Mansion. The exhibit was intended to not only provide solar power generation for a portion of the Lebel Mansion, but also to use it as an opportunity for educational display for the public regarding renewable energy.

The original proposal was for a total project cost of \$35,000 with approximately \$15,000 to be funded through grants and \$20,000 to be municipally funded. During budget deliberations, the project was cut from the 2023 Operating Budget.

In December 2022, Council formally accepted a \$10,000 grant from the Lethbridge Community Foundation to support the development of a renewable energy installation and educational display at the Lebel Mansion (resolution #22-510).

Enel Green Power has generously offered the Town of Pincher Creek a grant in the amount of \$7,000 USD (approximately \$9,000 CAD) towards the solar installation at the Lebel Mansion.

There has been no budgetary funds allocated to this project by the Town of Pincher Creek. Currently, the project has \$19,000 in grant funding

While acknowledging that Council formally accepted the Lethbridge Community Foundation in December 2022, administration does not have any formal approval, resolution, or direction from Council authorizing this project. Administration is seeking Council's direction whether to approve/move forward with the solar array project at the Lebel Mansion, and secondly to formally accept the funding offered by Enel Green Power.

PROJECT SCOPE

Please refer to attached summary of project scope, and how the project will differ based on full project scope (\$35,000 budget) or reduced project scope (\$19,000 in grant funding only).

The educational component of the project would include a television at the Lebel Mansion with real-time solar generation data (see attached proposed screen/slide show). Brochures would also be available.

PROJECT BENEFITS AND CONSEQUENCES

While the solar installation is anticipated to reduce electrical costs at the Lebel Mansion by \$700/year (based on full scope) or \$360/year (based on reduced scope), this means that the project will not recoup the installation costs over the lifespan of the installation.

Regardless of financial component, the introduction of solar energy to partially power the Lebel Mansion will ultimately reduce the greenhouse gas emissions from the facility.

It is difficult to quantify the benefit of an educational display, as this is a social benefit rather than financial.

There is potential social impact of the installation of solar panels on a designated historical building, potentially detracting from the historical nature of the facility.

The electrical system associated with the solar panels has a life expectancy of 15 years, meaning that replacement/maintenance costs would slightly increase the repairs & maintenance budget of the building.

ABOUT THE GRANT PROVIDER

Enel Green Power operates the Castle Rock Ridge wind farm in the M.D. of Pincher Creek and has expressed commitment to supporting community initiatives and education. They have committed \$7,000 USD of funding towards this project.

OVERALL RECOMMENDATION

Administration understands the potential benefits of the solar installation, however, when weighing all pros and cons do not feel this project should proceed. The full scope of the project has a negative financial return on investment, and in order to implement the full scope of the project would require the depletion of all remaining funds in the

Culture Reserve. Proceeding with a reduced scope would result in an even further reduction in energy cost savings, which were already minimal, at only \$360/year.

ALTERNATIVES:

1. That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek provide formal approval to accept \$7,000 USD (approximately \$9,000 CAD) of funding from Enel Green Power to support the installation of a solar array and renewable energy educational display at the Lebel Mansion, and authorize the signing of the Enel Green Power grant agreement; and

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek direct administration to proceed with the installation of a solar array and renewable energy educational display at the Lebel Mansion for a total of \$35,000 with \$19,000 being funded by grants, and the remaining \$16,000 to be funded from the Culture Reserve 7400004760 - \$14,000 and the remaining \$2,000 from the General Contingency Reserve 0000004710.

2. That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek direct administration to proceed with the installation of a solar array and renewable energy educational display at the Lebel Mansion for a reduced scope and total budget of \$19,000 to be solely grant funded.

3. That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek accepts the Lebel Mansion Solar Array presentation as information.

IMPLICATIONS/SUPPORT OF PAST STUDIES OR PLANS:

Lethbridge Community Foundation has already donated \$10,000 towards this project. Not moving forward with the project would require the Town to return/decline this funding.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The installation of a solar array projected to reduce energy costs at the Lebel Mansion by \$700/year (\$58/month), or at a reduced scope with savings at \$360/year (\$30/month).

The project requires approximately \$16,000 more in funding to meet the full scope budget, proposed to be funded through the Culture Reserve 7400004760 - \$14,000 and the remaining \$2,000 from the General Contingency Reserve 0000004710.

The estimated balance before these transactions for 2023 for the Culture Reserve is \$14,835.88 and for the General Contingency Reserve is \$247,489.52. Proceeding with the project would deplete the Culture Reserve.

PUBLIC RELATIONS IMPLICATIONS:

The renewable energy installation would be visible to the public and the accompanying educational exhibit would provide an opportunity to visitors to learn about the energy transition and history of energy ingenuity within Southern Alberta. It would also provide information for residents about renewable energy and how to undertake an install themselves.

There may be public dissatisfaction for installing solar panels on a historical building.

Ultimately administration feels that with limited reserve funds available, and the minimal returns from a reduced scope project, the project is not recommended to move forward.







PURPOSE:

For Council to review the dog park irrigation project update as presented and provide direction to administration on how to proceed.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek defer the dog park irrigation project to the 2024 budget deliberations.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

In 2018 the Town of Pincher Creek budgeted to build a fence at the Dog Park located at 6330 Range Road 30-1 (East of the Juan Teran Ball Diamonds). This land is owned by the Town of Pincher Creek but is in the M.D. of Pincher Creek's jurisdiction.

It is important to note that there is no mention of the development of a dog park in the Town's municipal development plan, nor has this project been through any process regarding the Intermunicipal Development Plan (the dog park is located within the area identified as the Hamlet of Lowland Heights).

In 2020, a group of volunteers planted several saplings at this Dog Park location with the expectation they could be hand watered by Town staff. Staff attempted to water the saplings but unfortunately, few of them survived. Small plants do best with daily watering, and there was insufficient staff capacity to accommodate this level of dedication.

The local volunteers also installed a personal water tank at the dog park location, so that pet owners could have water on site to water their pets. The expectation was that Town staff would fill the tank for the pet owners.

In the 2022 Budget deliberations, \$40,000 was earmarked to install irrigation at the fenced in dog park. This project originally intended to tie-in to the existing irrigation lines at the cemetery and run over to the the dog park. It was assumed there were 2" irrigation lines running to the west end of the cemetery, however, those lines are only 1" and would have been insufficient pressure to run irrigation at the Dog Park.

In the 2023 Budget deliberations an additional \$20,000 was added to the budget for a total of \$60,000. After consultation with the Operations Department, It was determined that it was inappropriate to provide a dedicated service to a lot through a different legal lot, while crossing an M.D. roadway. A new service would be required at this location with the tie-in to be to a Town operated watermain. The only adjacent waterline to this property is a 6" water line on the south side of Highway 785. Tying into this watermain requires drilling under the highway to create a new water service at the Dog Park.

Due to the complexity of running a water line under the highway, including the increased permitting required with Alberta Transportation, one of the Town's prequalified engineering firms were contracted to design and provide construction administration services.

The engineer surveyed the area in March 2023 and provided administration with a preliminary design and cost estimate to have the waterline extended under Highway 785.

The costs of proceeding as planned with this project far exceeds the original budget and administration is seeking Council's direction on moving forward with this project. Administrative discussions have also included the aspect of not only irrigation, but providing water for dogs at the park.

OPTION 1 - PROCEED WITH DOG PARK IRRIGATION

The current estimated costs to provide a water service to the property is \$85,000. This total includes engineering and construction but **does not** include irrigation lines after the service valve at property line. It is estimated that the installation of an irrigation system through the property would be an additional \$40,000. Installation of a dedicated line for watering animals would be an additional \$7,500.

OPTION 2 - NON-POTABLE WATER TANK

The Town could install a non-potable watertank for approximately \$1,500 which park users can utilize to water their animals. This tank would not have any ability to provide irrigation. The Town would assume increased liability if an animal were to become sick from drinking water from a Town sanctioned non-potable water source.

OPTION 3 - REFRIGERATED POTABLE WATER TANK

Purchase a portable potable water tank called the Quench Solo to be used at this location. Approximate cost is \$10,000.00 for the unit itself and does not need a water source, It uses five gallon jugs and only requires power to keep the chiller running, The cost to hook up power being a new service would need to be run from across the road to a new power pole and down to the Quench Solo approximate cost for power is \$25,000.00. and would take the time of one staff member 2 hours a week to clean and change bottles. Once finished at the dog park it could alternatively be used for events and and indoor spaces during the winter months.

OPTION 4 - NO IRRIGATION BUT REPLACE TREES

Purchase more established trees for this location and water using tree bags to ensure survival of the trees. Approximate cost to plant 40 trees and shrubs is \$12,000, no additional cost for tree bags. Water filling for the tree bags would take 1 staff member 4-6 hours/week to fill.

OPTION 5 - CANCEL PROJECT

Not to proceed with the addition of any watering solutions, or tree planting at the Dog Park, and have this line item removed from the 2023 capital budget plan.

Administration has discussed that the proposed solutions are a significant investment for an area that does not have any formal plans for development, and adjacent lands that have the potential for annexation in the indeterminate future, which would require watermain extension and make the feasibility of providing irrigation services to the Dog Park much more affordable in the future if the planning work needed was to be undertaken with the MD of Pincher Creek.

ALTERNATIVES:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek increase the dog park irrigation project budget from \$60,000 to \$140,000 to be funded from the General Parks Reserve account #7105004760.

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek amend the dog park irrigation project to a reduced scope of installing a non-potable water tank to be maintained by the community services department.

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek amend the dog park irrigation project to a reduced scope of installing a refrigerated potable water tank to be maintained by the community services department, including construction of a new power supply to the property.

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek amend the dog park irrigation project to a reduced scope of installing 40 trees and shrubs with tree bags for watering, to be maintained by the community services department.

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek remove the dog park irrigation project from the approved capital project list.

IMPLICATIONS/SUPPORT OF PAST STUDIES OR PLANS:

Upgrades to existing outdoor facilities was the #3 priority in the 2020 Regional Recreation Master Plan.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The engineering and project management costs for this project were quoted at \$22,250 and to date \$5,000 has been spent on engineering to have surveying completed

including a drawing locating the future waterline expansion, and an outline of probable construction costs.

The 2023 Estimated Balance in the General Parks Reserve without this additional cost is \$107,849.16.

Of the above outlined potential options, Options 2-5 do not require budget amendments. Option 1 would require a budget increase of \$80,000 to be funded by the General Parks Reserve 7105004760.

The existing budget of \$60,000 is currently funded through the same General Parks Reserve.

PUBLIC RELATIONS IMPLICATIONS:

The fenced in Dog Park is used by residents from in and around the community and is seen as a benefit to the pet owners.


