2025 PROPERTY ASSESSMENTS

The Assessment Roll for the Town of Pincher Creek has been prepared for the 2025 taxation year and were mailed on February 28, 2025. Notice is hereby given, as required under the Municipal Government Act (s.311) that the Assessment Notices have been sent.

The Assessment Roll of the Municipality can be found on the Town of Pincher Creek website at www.pinchercreek.ca/assessments or by at the town office during regular business hours.



Review your assessment: Does it seem that the assessed value of your property is a reasonable estimate as of July 1 of last year? Are the factual details that the Town has on record for your property correct? Does your assessment seem equitable when compared to similar properties in your neighborhood?

Any person who wishes to object to the entry of his or her name or of any other person upon the said roll or to the assessed value placed upon any property, may lodge their complaint, in writing, with the applicable complaint fee, by May 7, 2025, at 4:00pm attention Legislative Services Manager at the town office located at 962 St. John Avenue.

Prior to filing a written complaint, you are encouraged to fill out the assessor's inquiry form at http://kcl-consulting.com/inquiry-form or contact the Town at 403-627-3156 to request that the designated assessor review your property assessment. If the assessor determines that an error has been made, your assessment will be revised.

Mailing date: February 28, 2025

Notice of Assessment date: March 7, 2025

Appeal deadline: May 7, 2025

PLEASE NOTE: It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure they receive a property assessment notice. If you do not receive your notice by mid-April, contact the Town office at 403-627-3156.

PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENT PLANS

TAX INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PROGRAM (TIPP) OR DIRECT ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER (DEFT)

TIPP is an optional monthly tax installment payment plan by which taxpayers may authorize monthly direct withdrawal from your bank account rather than paying the full amount in one payment. Provided regular monthly payments are made, penalties for late payment of taxes will not apply to any tax account under TIPP.

DEFT is an optional bi-monthly automatic withdrawal for the amount of bi-monthly utility billing. Never forget to pay and avoid penalties for late payments.

DEVELOPMENT OFFICE

SUBDIVISION AND DEVLEOPMENT APPEALS

Do you disagree with an approved development permit, a condition added to a development permit or subdivision, or a stop order? You may be able to submit an appeal.

What can be appealed?	Who can file an appeal?
Development Permit - approval, refusal, or conditions of approval	 The Development Permit applicant Citizen or group that feels they are impacted by the decision Town Council An adjacent landowner for a variance or discretionary use (a development permit for a use that is listed as permitted use in a district typically cannot be appealed by an adjacent landowner. The SDAB will determine it if they decide to hear any appeal.)



Enforcement order or "stop order"	 The person to whom the stop order was issued (typically the landowner)
Subdivision or conditions of subdivision	The applicant
	 Government department to which subdivision was referred
	Town Council
	 School board if an application is related to school reserve land
	 (Adjacent landowners cannot appeal a subdivision approval)

You will need to file your appeal with one of two boards: the Chinook Intermunicipal Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB) or the Land and Property Rights Tribunal (Tribunal). Normally appeals are filed to the SDAB.

When would you need to file with the Tribunal? Visit https://www.alberta.ca/subdivision-appeals for more information.

The Tribunal hears an appeal of the development authority decisions where the land subject to the application is:

- the subject of a license, permit, approval, or other authorization granted by the Natural Resources Conservation Board, Energy Resources Conservation Board, Alberta Energy Regulator, Alberta Energy and Utilities Board, or Alberta Utilities Commission
- the subject of a license, permit, approval, or other authorization granted by the Minister of Environment and Protected Areas or the Minister of Forestry and Parks

The Tribunal hears subdivision appeals where the land that the subject of the application is: within Alberta's Green Area

- 'adjacent' to or contains a body of water
- 'adjacent' means contiguous or would be contiguous if not for a railway, road, utility right of way, or reserve land
- adjacent to or contains (either partially or wholly) land identified on the Listing of Historic Resources or public land set aside for use as historic resource
- the subject of a license, permit, approval or other authorization granted by the Natural Resources Conservation Board, Energy Resources Conservation Board, Alberta Energy Regulator, Alberta Energy and Utilities Board or Alberta Utilities Commission
- the subject of a license, permit, approval or other authorization granted by the Minister of Environment and Protected Areas
- within the following distances:
 - 1600 metres of a provincial highway
 - 450 metres of a hazardous waste management facility
 - 450 metres of the working area of an operating landfill
 - o 300 metres of the disposal area of any landfill
 - o 300 metres of a wastewater treatment plant
 - o 300 metres of the working area of a non-hazardous waste storage site

Some of these distances may be varied in writing by a provincial government department, in which case the SDAB will hear the appeal.

What are the fees to file an appeal?

\$300.00 | Appeal Fee

\$400.00 | Special Meeting Request Fee

A Special Meeting Request is to request that the hearing is to be held sooner than the regulated 30 days from the date the appeal has been filed. Appeal fees are non-refundable, even if the submitter chooses to withdraw the appeal.

JANUARY 13, 2025 - REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

- Indoor Sport Courts Project
 - Council committed up to \$75,000 towards the purchase of indoor sport court equipment for the MCC arena subject to approval of the Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) Grant
- Lebel Mansion Window Replacement
 - Council allocated up to \$200,000 for the window replacement project at the Lebel Mansion in 2025 including amounts from grants
- Municipal Borrowing Bylaw 1570-25 for the renewal of a line of credit and corporate credit cards was passed
- Designating the Lebel Mansion as a Municipal Historic Resource 1614-24 was passed
- Pincher Creek Curling Club
 - Council directed administration to prepare Terms of Reference for a lease document for the development of a Curling Rink and Curling/Golf Clubhouse
 - Council directed administration to set up an open house to present information to the community
- Multi-purpose facility Activity Space
 - o Council accepted the lease termination request from the leassee
- Coal Development Policy of Alberta: Council would like to meet with the Ministry to discuss



JANUARY 27, 2025 - REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

- Multi-purpose Facility Activity Space
 - Council directed administration to seek out expressions of interest from the community for use and/or leasing of the activity space
- RIPPLE Community Fund
 - Council supports the establishment of a Field of Interest Endowment Fund at the Community Foundation of Lethbridge and Southwestern Alberta
- Oldman Rose Society Grant Hosting Request: Council agreed to host a grant application for the Oldman Rose Society
- Matthew Halton High School Banners
 - o Council agreed to sponsor a banner in the amount of \$525.00
- Remedial Work for Residential Property
 - Council authorized up to \$50,000 for the remedial work to 470 Schofield Street prior to listing the property for sale

FEBRUARY 10, 2025 - REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

- Hyde Street access to Hwy 6 Council directed administration to discontinue investigating this access in response to the information provided in the report
- School and Playground signs upgrades are authorized for an amount up to \$27,500
- Curling Facility Update
 - Council directed administration to draft a twenty-year lease on three lots at 1101, 1103, and 1105
 Chief Mountain Avenue to relocate the Curling Facility
 - Administration has been directed to prepare a report on the cost recovery and additional cost for the relocation of the Pincher Creek Curling Club
- Council sponsored \$500 to the Piikani Hockey Group for the Men's and Ladies' Basketball Tournament
