The Town of Pincher Creek sent the 2025 Property Tax Notifications on May 1, 2026.

### PROPERTY OWNERS' IMPORTANT NOTICE

It is the property owners RESPONSIBILITY to ensure they receive a property tax notice. If you have not received a property tax notice by mid-June 2026, and you are a property owner (including mobile homes), please contact the town office at 403-627-3156 to get a copy to avoid penalties for late payment.

## HAVE YOU RECENTLY PURCHASED A PROPERTY OR HOME?

Did you receive a tax notice? If not, please connect with the Town Office immediately.

## PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT DEADLINE IS JUNE 30, 2026

Payments can be made in person by attending the Town Office, 962 St. John Avenue and/or leaving payments in mail slot, by mail, online banking or at any financial institution (please take your bill). To avoid late penalties property tax payments must be received at the Town Office by June 30, 2026 (please note Canada Post no longer post marks mail, so payments must be **received** in the office by the deadline). To ensure that your payment goes onto your account when using online banking please use the full 12-digit account (roll) number without the decimal that can be found on your tax notice. Please note if a tax payment is made online after hours on the due date the bank may post it to the following day. Please try not to make late payments or you may be required to submit proof of payment date to avoid penalties applied to your account.

## IMPORTANT PENALTY INFORMATION

Penalty charges on outstanding current taxes will be levied at 12% on July 1, 2026. A further 10% penalty will be assessed on all remaining unpaid taxes January 3, 2027.

This new service will be managed by Circular Materials, a national not-for-profit, responsible for Alberta's transition to Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) for packaging and paper products.

Soon, you'll be able to recycle materials like glass, foam packaging, flexible and rigid plastic packaging, cardboard, paper and metal containers and packaging in your curbside recycling program and at your local depot.

## PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENT PLANS

### TAX INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PROGRAM (TIPP) OR DIRECT ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER (DEFT)

TIPP is an optional monthly tax installment payment plan by which taxpayers may authorize monthly direct withdrawal from your bank account rather than paying the full amount in one payment.

Provided regular monthly payments are made, penalties for late payment of taxes will not apply to any tax account under TIPP.

DEFT is an optional bi-monthly automatic withdrawal for the amount of bi-monthly utility billing. Never forget to pay and avoid penalties for late payments.

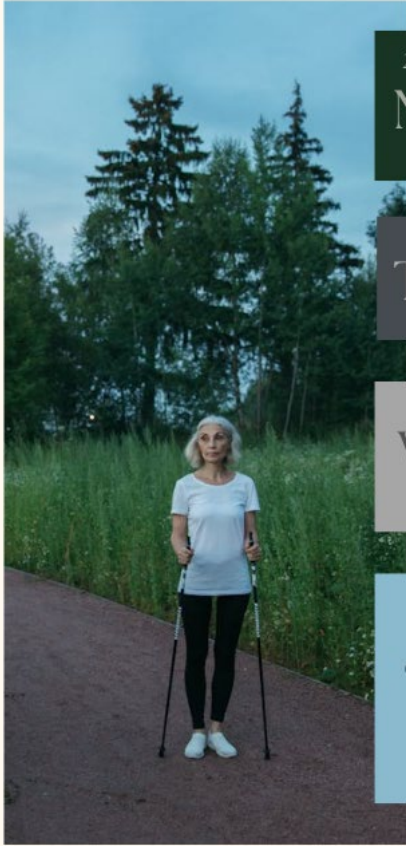

## DEVELOPMENT CORNER

### WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU PLAN ANY DEVELOPMENT

If you are planning a development in the Town of Pincher Creek, here's what you need to know to ensure your Development Permit Application is complete and processed smoothly.

Development has the same meaning as it has in the Municipal Government Act (MGA)

Development includes:

- a) an excavation or stockpile and the creation of either of them;
- b) a building or an addition to or replacement or repair of a building and the construction or placing of any of them in, on, over or under land;
- c) a change of use of land or a building or an act done in relation to land or a building that results in or is likely to result in a change in the use of the land or building; or
- d) a change in the intensity of use of land or a building or an act done in relation to land or a building that results in or is likely to result in a change in the intensity of use of the land or building.

### **Know Your Land Use District**

- All residential developments are regulated under Land Use Bylaw 1639-25.
- Confirm your zoning district (e.g. R1 – Residential).
- Verify that your proposed use (single-detached, semi-detached, townhouse, commercial or industrial uses) are permitted or discretionary.
- Check setbacks, lot coverage, and building height before applying.

### **Prepare Your Documents**

Applications should include:

- Site Plan – showing the setbacks to the location of buildings from the property lines, driveways, and parking spaces dimensions
- Grading and drainage plan (if required)
- Floor Plans & Elevations – showing building size, layout, and height
- Lot Dimensions – for accurate lot coverage calculations
- Demolition Permit – if existing structures will be removed
- Fees – application fee and required deposits

### **Completing the Application Form**

Key sections to complete:

- Applicant & owner information
- Property details: address, legal description, lot/plan number, size
- Proposed development: dwelling type, floor area, height, lot coverage, parking
- Variances/Waivers: setback, building height, or lot coverage



## Typical requirements for single-detached dwellings in a Residential – R1 District

| Requirement                 | Standard                                 |
|-----------------------------|--|
| Front yard setback          | 6.1m (20ft)                              |
| Side yard setback           | 1.5m (5ft) / 3.0m (10ft)                 |
| Rear yard setback           | 7.6m (25ft)                              |
| Maximum height              | 8.5m (28ft)                              |
| Maximum lot coverage        | 45%                                      |
| Driveway width              | 7.62m (25ft) maximum                     |
| Minimum parking spaces      | 2  |
| Minimum dwelling floor area | 83.6m <sup>2</sup> (900ft <sup>2</sup> ) |

Tip: Always check the current Land Use Bylaw for exact numbers for your zoning district.

### Fees & Submissions

- Application fee and any required deposits must be submitted to process your application.
- Applications are circulated to relevant Town departments or outside organizations for review and comments.
- The Town has a 20-day window to deem an application complete.

### Compliance & Conditions

Development permits may include conditions such as:

- Site access and road cleanup
- Utility connections
- Landscaping or fencing requirements
- Timing for demolition or construction

Important: Non-compliance may result in Stop Orders, fines, or Town-arranged cleanup at the Applicant's expense.

### Tips for a Smooth Application

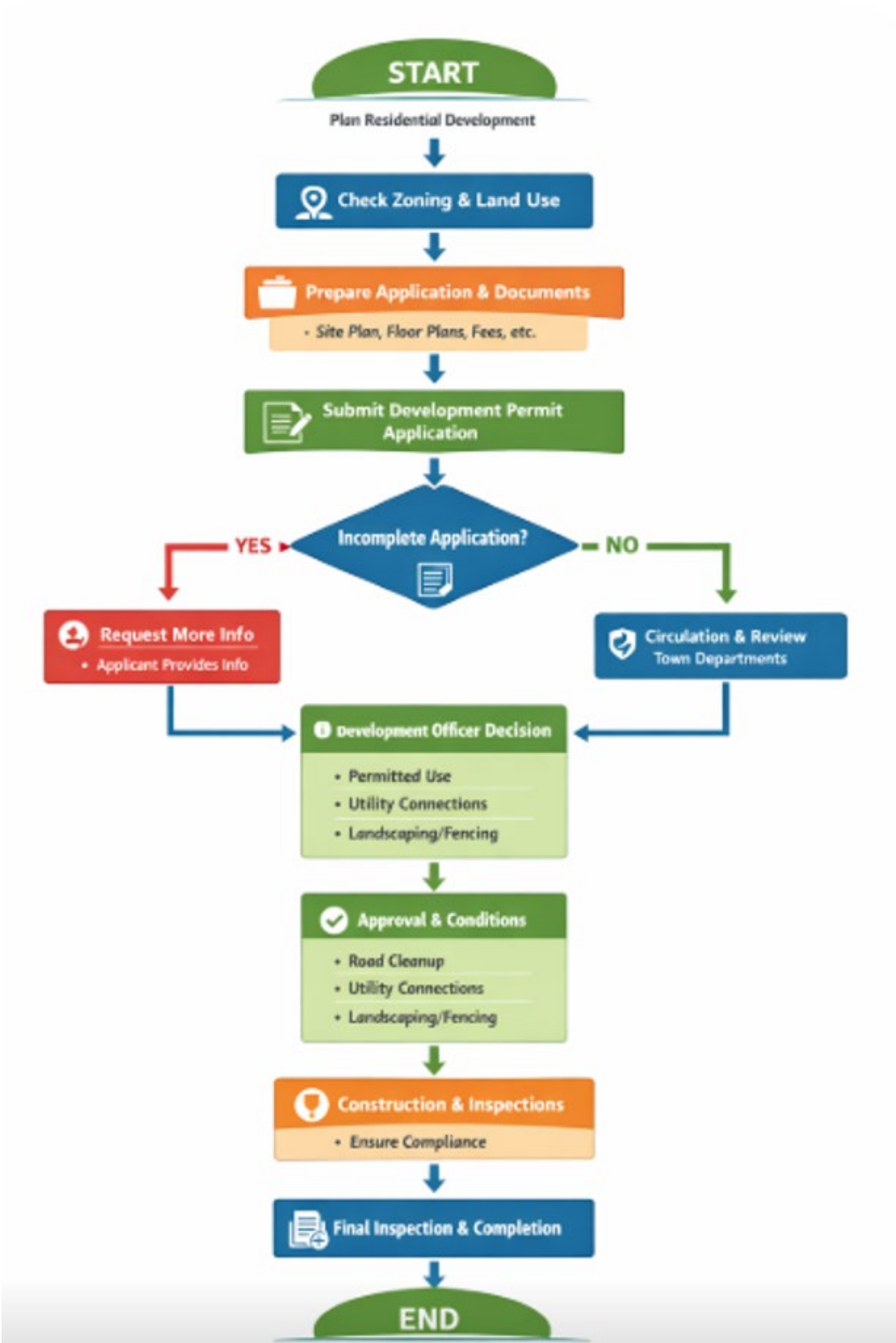
- Double-check that all plans match legal lot information.

- Include photos or diagrams if needed.
- Respond promptly to Town requests for additional information.
- Keep copies of all correspondence, approvals, and receipts.
