

GARBAGE COLLECTION REMINDERS

To help keep our community clean and collection services running smoothly, please follow these important requirements:

- ✓ Don't overfill your bin Leave at least 5 cm (2 inches) of space from the top of the bin so the lid can close properly.
- O Cardboard and construction materials are not accepted in residential or business garbage bins. Please take cardboard to a local recycling depot.
- Place your cart at the curb in front of your home where the Town can easily access it. Make sure it's not blocked by vehicles or other objects.
- Have your bin out by 8:00 a.m. on collection day crews start early!

▲ Missed pick-up?

If your bin is overfilled, not out on time, or blocked by a vehicle, it may not be collected. If a return trip is needed, an additional garbage pickup fee will apply.

Bins that are broken, unsafe, or unsanitary may not be collected. Please keep your bins in good condition.

WATER MAIN FLUSHING

We're doing routine water main flushing to help clean the inside of our water pipes. This process uses fast-moving water to wash out any buildup inside the pipes and improve water quality.

Flushing will take place intermittently over the next couple of months. You may see water flowing along the streets during this time — that's normal.
