2026 FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES GRANT APPLICATIONS

IMPORTANT: Due to new reporting requirements for the province, we have updated the application and process. Please review the FAQ and Guidebook and use the Budget Reporting Template found at https://pinchercreek.ca/fcss.

The Pincher Creek & District Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) program provides financial support for the delivery of preventative social programs designed to enhance the well-being of individuals, families, and communities.

To be eligible, programs must:

- Be of a preventive nature that enhances the social well-being of individuals and families through promotion or intervention strategies provided at the earliest opportunity, and
- Do one or more of the following
 - help people to develop independence, strengthen coping skills and become more resistant to crisis;
 - help people to develop an awareness of social needs;
 - o help people to develop interpersonal and group skills;
 - help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions which affect them:
 - o provide supports that help sustain people as active participants in the community.

Programs and Services not eligible under the program include those that:

- provide primarily for the recreational needs or leisure time pursuits of individuals;
- are intended to sustain an individual or family (ie. Providing food, clothing or shelter);
- are primarily rehabilitative in nature; or
- duplicate services that are ordinarily provided by a government or government agency.

Counselling Services

Counselling can provide you with a confidential and non-judgmental space to better understand your feelings, thoughts, and behaviours, while enhancing relationship growth and psychological well-being.

Lethbridge Family Services is proud to provide subsidized counselling, both in-person and online, in Pincher Creek and the Crowsnest Pass.

Areas of Practice

Counselling services are provided to those needing support with difficulties such as trauma, abuse, sexual violence, family violence, grief and loss, gender identity, and/or sexual orientation.

Eligibility

- Individuals aged 13 to end of life.
- Day appointments only.
- In-person and online counselling is available. Location of in-person appointments will be discussed during intake.

Financial Investment

Fees will be discussed at the time of Intake. No person will be denied service based on financial hardship.

Note: Individuals whose primary concern is mental health diagnosis, addiction, or eating disorder will be referred to Recovery Alberta. Workplace issues and vehicle accidents will be referred to appropriate services as well.

How to Book an Appointment

Individuals seeking counselling must call our Counselling Intake Team at 403-327-5724. In cases of children, parents/guardians must call.

Office Hours

- All offices are closed statutory holidays.
- Our Pincher Creek office is open Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.

RENT ASSISTANCE BENEFIT

Pincher Creek Foundation / Crestview Lodge is the local administrator of the Provincial Rent Assistance Benefit. The Rent Assistance Benefit (RAB) is a program in Alberta that provides a subsidy to help make rental accommodations more affordable for individuals and families. Recipient households living in market rental housing receive a monthly benefit payment to subsidize their housing costs.

If you feel you could benefit by this program, please contact Crestview at (403) 627-3833.

To qualify for provincial affordable housing programs, applicants must:

- have an income below local income limits as determined by the market for that community,
- be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, refugee, applicant of refugee or immigrant status; or landed immigrant for whom private sponsorship has broken down,
- evacuees from Ukraine with Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel are eligible to apply.
