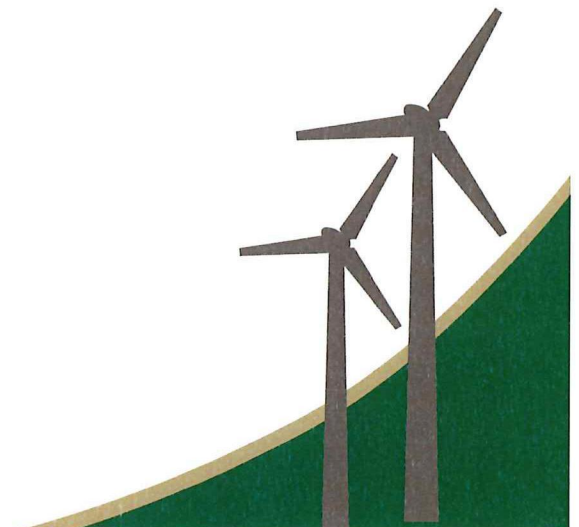

SUBJECT: Sproule Field Batting Cage - Disposition of Delegation	
PRESENTED BY: Adam Grose, Recreation Manager	DATE OF MEETING: 10/28/2024

PURPOSE:

to dispose of a delegation request from Gordon McMullen representing the Pincher Creek Minor Baseball Association, and Matthew Halton High School Baseball to have a new batting cage erected at Sproule Baseball Field.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek accept the May 13th, 2024 delegation from Gord McMullen with thanks, and to agree to have a new batting cage installed at Sproule field and direct administration to work with Pincher Creek Minor Baseball to have the new batting cage installed in accordance with the Town of Pincher Creek development requirements.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

On May 13th, 2024 Gord McMullen attended the regular meeting of Council as a delegation on behalf of Pincher Creek Minor Baseball and High School Baseball to ask for permission to install a new batting cage at Sproule Ball diamond. There is an existing metal frame for a batting cage at Sproule field, however, it cannot be used because there is no mesh or fencing installed on the frame. Additionally the preferred location for the batting cage would ideally be located closer to the home team bench.

ALTERNATIVES:

To accept the May 13th, 2024 delegation from Gord McMullen and Pincher Creek Minor Baseball as information.

Direct administration to add the the new batting cage project to the 2025 budget negotiations for consideration.

IMPLICATIONS/SUPPORT OF PAST STUDIES OR PLANS:

The 2022-2026 Strategic Priorities for Council include to Promote and support community sustainability through partnerships, and Maintaining and improving the physical assets of our Town.

Additionally the number 3 priority in the Regional Recreation Master Plan is to Upgrade existing outdoor facilities.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

At this time there has not been a request for funds from the Town of Pincher Creek for this project. Administration time to assist Pincher Creek Minor Baseball would be minimal.

PUBLIC RELATIONS IMPLICATIONS:

The addition of a functioning batting cage at Sproule Ball Diamond would be viewed as a positive addition by those individuals utilizing this facility.

PURPOSE:

Update to Council from the property auction held on October 21, 2024.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek accept the Report - Public Auction Land Not Sold as information.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

As per section 418(1) of the Municipal Government Act, "Each municipality must offer for sale at a public auction any parcel of land shown on its tax arrears list if the tax arrears are not paid."

An auction for the property located at PLAN 8810262, BLOCK 15, LOT 10 was held on October 21, 2024 at 10:00 am at the Town office building in Pincher Creek, Alberta.

The property did not sell which means Council for the Town of Pincher Creek may assume title for the property.

Administration has added the property to the Town's insurance policy and the locks have been changed.

The Town can sell the property at a price as close as reasonably possible to fair market value.

In order to determine fair market value, the property must be inspected and cleaned as needed. Then an appraiser will need to be hired to assess fair market value.

The Town is able to recover all costs to date as well as the costs associated with selling the property. The Town will retain 5% of the sale price as an administration fee.

The surplus proceeds would then be set aside for the registered owner & registered interests to apply to the court for.

By assuming title and disposing of the property the Town is able to recover back taxes and the cost of recovering said property taxes.

The public auction was held as scheduled on October 21, 2024. Town of Pincher Creek offered the following property for sale, however; it did not sell.

Roll No	Lot	Block	Plan	C of T	Reserve Bid

The municipality may now become the owner of the above noted property. If the municipality chooses to take title, the property becomes exempt from future taxation. The only cost to the municipality in order to become the owner of the parcel is the cost to register the required forms with Alberta Land Titles. We recommend the municipality take title of the properties not sold at auction, provided that you are not aware of any potential liability concerns. (e.g., environmental or dilapidated buildings)

The following paragraphs all apply to taking Title:

By taking title, the municipality can choose to:

1. Dispose of the parcel by either:
 - a. selling the property, at any time, and according to any conditions it chooses. Some possible options include direct sale, by tender, through a real estate agent, or by any other means that support selling the property at a price as close as reasonably possible to fair market value; or
 - b. keeping the property and depositing an amount of money equal to the reserve bid into a separate account that has been established solely for the purpose of depositing money from the sale of land under Tax Recovery Proceedings.
2. Grant a lease, license, or permit in respect of the parcel.

The municipality would become the legal owner of the property and, provided that the property is not in use, would be entitled to take possession and exclude others from entering upon its property. Also, the municipality would want to ensure insurance is in place as deemed necessary. You may want to verify whether your general policy would cover the newly acquired property or if additional coverage will be required.

If the tax arrears and all related costs in respect of a property are paid before the municipality disposes of the property as mentioned in 1 above or while leasing the property as mentioned in 2 above, the original title must be revived in the name of the former owner(s).

Should the municipality choose not to sell the land but retain title in their name with a tax forfeiture registered against title, the municipality can, after 15 years, apply to land titles to remove the tax forfeiture notice, cancel the existing title for the parcel and issue a new title in the name of the municipality. Once this new title is issued, the municipality can use or dispose of the property without regard to the former owner.

The following paragraph applies to NOT taking Title:

If the municipality chooses not to take title, the property will remain taxable and the municipality cannot dispose of it, grant a lease, license, or permit in respect to the parcel.

Please confirm whether the municipality chooses to become the owner of the parcels not sold at auction and we will attend to preparation of the transmission and required affidavits with respect to the property. We will forward the documents to you in due course for your signature and seal.

SUBJECT: Engine Repair - Unit 208 - 2018 Garbage Truck	
PRESENTED BY:	DATE OF MEETING: 10/28/2024

PURPOSE:

To maintain existing service levels, two garbage trucks are required to ensure that one is operable when the other is undergoing maintenance activities. Unit 208 is in need of engine repair or replacement.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek agree to fund up to \$80,000.00 from reserves for the repair or replacement of the engine in Unit 208.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY:

To maintain existing service levels two garbage trucks are required to ensure that one is operable when the other is undergoing maintenance activities.

Unit 208 is a 2018 Freightliner and Unit 201 is a 2020 Freightliner. Unit 208 was identified for replacement in 2024 to meet a planned eight-year replacement schedule, however due to financial reasons, the replacement was deferred.

Service records for Unit 208 show that issues with oil leaks, DEF/DPF and regeneration, have been ongoing since 2020. Unit 208 also includes an extensive out of service time in 2024 for repair of oil leaks at the front crank seal. Issues have continued when the unit was returned to service, and the latest inspection identifies the requirement to rebuild or replace the engine.

ALTERNATIVES:

That Council for the Town of Pincher Creek direct administration to continue garbage operations with a single garbage truck and attempt to utilize contracted services for garbage collection to maintain service levels when there are maintenance and/or service interruptions.

IMPLICATIONS/SUPPORT OF PAST STUDIES OR PLANS:

The planned replacement schedule (budget in 2023 with replacement in 2024) was deferred, therefore alternative solutions need to be researched and proposed to ensure service levels are maintained.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The \$80,000.00 for the engine replacement is proposed to be funded from the Garbage Equipment Reserve.

PUBLIC RELATIONS IMPLICATIONS:

Municipal garbage collection is an important service provided to the residents and businesses of Pincher Creek.

ATTACHMENTS:

None at this time.

CONCLUSION/SUMMARY:

The repair or replacement of the engine for Unit 208 will provide the time required for Administration to research, plan and develop solutions for Council's review on the future of garbage collection.

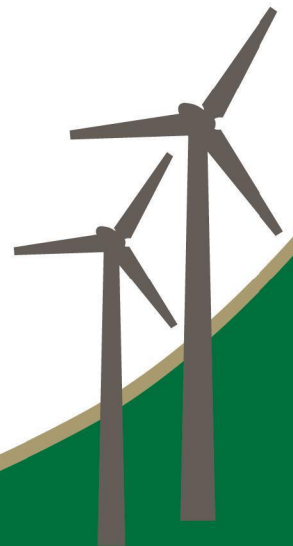

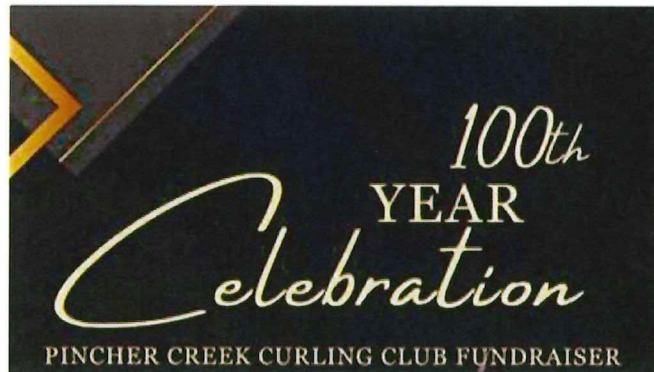
